

THE SUMMER HANGOVER: SURGE IN ENQUIRIES FOR SUN DAMAGE

Mole assessment enquiries more than double (103%) in September

Skin cancer screening enquiries up by a third (33%)

Dermatology clinics see a 29% rise in enquiries following the summer months;

dermatologist consultations up 59%

• Increase in searches for pigmentation treatment more than doubles (124%) in

past two years

Laser skin resurfacing enquiries up 40% despite a hefty £678 price tag

Monday 20 October 2014 - Britons' tan lines may have long since faded after one of

the hottest summers on record, but an increasing number of us are worried that the

sun may have caused lasting damage, according to new research from private

healthcare search engine, WhatClinic.com.

Its figures reveal that enquiries for mole assessments more than doubled (103%) in the

six-week period following summer holidays<sup>[1]</sup>. Mole assessment is the process of

carefully examining all moles on the body and identifying any that look suspicious for

further examination.

Skin cancer screening enquiries rose by a third (33%) in the same period, while

dermatology clinics also saw a rise in enquiries across the board of nearly a third

(29%). Interest in specialist dermatologist consultations increased by 59% - with a one-

on-one session costing an average of £89.

Laser skin resurfacing, which tops the charts as the most expensive treatment, at a

whopping £678 on average, also saw enquiry levels rise by 40%. The pricey treatment



is an effective way of treating age spots, brown sun spots and pigmentation. It also evens skin tones and lines and wrinkles, as a result of sun exposure.

The greatest driver of enquiries is pigmentation of the skin – a common problem that occurs over time as a result of sun damage. The number of people seeking treatment for skin pigmentation has increased by 124% in the past two years.

Corrective treatment – which can take several months – evens skin tone and lessens the appearance of sun damage although it may return if patients continue to expose themselves.

The table below shows the top sun damage treatments and the increase in enquiries in the weeks following summer, compared to the July/August period:

"Malignant melanoma is the fifth most common cancer in the UK, so skin screenings

and mole checks are essential for all the family if you notice anything out of the

ordinary, especially after the wonderful weather."

Alicia Trenchard, aesthetic practitioner at CosmeDocs, comments: "Collagen fibres in

the skin are damaged by UV rays - losing elasticity and resulting in wrinkling and a

crepey appearance. It is easy to tell if someone has had years of sun exposure in a hot

climate, as the skin texture is usually more leathery.

"The primary effect of strong, or prolonged, sun exposure is the stimulation of melanin

which can be distributed in a patchy fashion, for skin types not programmed to

tolerate a lot of UV rays.

"If you have suffered the ageing affects of sun damage, there are a range of

treatments available to combat them, such as IPL, laser treatments and chemical peels.

However, to prevent sun damage from occurring, make sure to use a high SPF

sunscreen and try to cover up when in extremely hot weather."
